A bit of Christian history for St. Patrick's Day:

Today many around the world celebrate the life of "St. Patrick." Patrick was a 5th century Roman who went by the name Patricius. He was from a well-off family who lived in Britain. When Patrick was a teenager, he was abducted to primitive Ireland and forced to work as a shepherd slave. He was isolated with little food and clothing in cold weather. In the six years of his suffering, he devoted himself to God and prayer. He eventually escaped his captors guided by what he described as "a mysterious voice."

Although his family begged him to stay with them, Patrick began having dreams and visions of the Irish people calling on him to return. It was a thought that was akin to being stabbed. Finally, he experienced the calling of God to go back to Ireland.

Patrick not only sacrificed a noble place in Roman society, but put himself at risk to return to his place of slavery. It was an incredible act of self-sacrifice and humility. Patrick would eventually not only change the Irish civilization, but all of history. He discipled, trained, and educated the masses. Ireland went from a chaotic and erratic culture to one that was more and more civilized. When the barbarians sacked Rome and its culture, they burned all of the ancient literature. All of it would have been lost had it not been for the Irish monks educated because of Patrick that copied all of those historic works. The story of Patrick's legacy goes far beyond a community or a generation. He changed the world.

Patrick described himself as a "most humble-minded man, pouring forth a continuous paean of thanks to his Maker for having chosen him as the instrument whereby multitudes who had worshipped idols and unclean things had become the people of God."

So why is the shamrock the National Flower of Ireland? The reason is that Patrick used the 3 -leafed plant to explain the Holy Trinity to the pagans.

Saint Patrick's Day has come to be associated with everything Irish: anything green and gold, shamrocks and luck. But much more importantly, to those who celebrate its intended meaning, St. Patrick's Day is a traditional day for spiritual renewal and offering prayers for missionaries worldwide.



Luke 23:32-43

The Prayer of a Dying Thief

- A. Two criminals were crucified with Jesus, one on each side.
- 1. One of them insulted Jesus: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"
- 2. The other one defended Jesus and prayed for forgiveness:
 - a. "This man has done nothing wrong."
- b. "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."
- B. Jesus answered him: "Today you will be with me in paradise."
 - 1. "Today" immediate salvation
- 2. "with me" personal salvation
- 3. "Paradise" heavenly salvation
- C. Three lessons of hope and encouragement
- 1. It is never too late to turn to Christ.
- 2. Even the worst can be saved at the last moment.
- 3. All that God requires for salvation is faith in Jesus Christ.
